## HURRICANE SEASON (JUNE 1 - Nov. 30)

Do you know what to do if a hurricane threatens the Rio Grande Valley?  
When do you show up for work or classes after a storm strike? This flyer will help you in the event of a hurricane. Keep on hand to refer to before and after a hurricane. Remember, we live in an area that is at high risk for hurricanes, so don't let one catch you off guard.



If a hurricane threatens, watch for the hurricane alert notices on [www.utb.edu](http://www.utb.edu). Notifications will also be sent to your utb.edu e-mail account.

If UTB/TSC closes, notifications will be sent to your utb.edu e-mail account with date and time of closing. Notifications will also be posted to the utb.edu home page and Hurricane Alert page ([www.utb.edu/ba/hurricane](http://www.utb.edu/ba/hurricane)).

In the event of a hurricane, please keep in mind to have a few basic supplies on hand, including:

- Water
- Food (non-perishable for up to 3-7 days)
- First-aid kit, medicines and prescription drugs
- Flashlights with fresh batteries
- Radio with fresh batteries  
(In the event of a power loss, listen to one of the designated radio stations for the latest UTB/TSC announcements.)
- Fully-charged cell phone
- Cash
- Important documents
- Vehicle with full fuel tank
- Extra batteries
